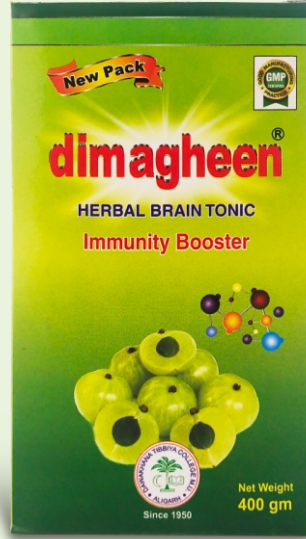

EVENTS AT IBN SINA ACADEMY (July –September 2021)

Avicenna Clinical Pharmacology Quiz 5.0

Avicenna Clinical Pharmacology Quiz was arranged by Ibn Sina Academy and concluded with the announcement of results on 13.9.2021. It is being sponsored by Dr. Misbah Uddin Mohammad, an illustrious alumnus of the Department of Pharmacology, JNMC, AMU, Aligarh, for the last 5 years. This year, the event was organised in collaboration with Medical Students Network of Indian Medical Association (MSN-IMA), JNMC, AMU, Aligarh with the entry of more than 500 participants across the country. There were 4 rounds spread over a period of 2 days via online mode on 11/09/2021 to 12/09/2021. These four rounds were: R-1 Screening, R-2 Clinical, R-3 Image-based and R-4 Rapid Fire. CONDOLENCE MEETINGS

Condolence on the demise of Prof. Abul Kalam Qasmi

The members and well-wishers of the Ibn Sina Academy deeply mourned the demise of Professor Abul Kalam Qasmi.

Professor Abul Kalam Qasmi was a reputed critic and scholar of Urdu. He remained as Dean, Faculty of Arts and Chairman, Department of Urdu, Aligarh Muslim University. He died after a prolonged illness at the age of 71 and was laid to rest at the university graveyard.

Mourning his death, President of Ibn Sina Academy, Prof. Syed Zillur Rahman, said that Prof. Qasmi was closely associated with Ibn Sina Academy and always tried to attend all functions held at the Academy. He held in great esteem in literary circles for his insightful writings. His books got recognition in India and abroad and he brought laurels for his alma mater, AMU. His demise is a big loss and the literary fraternity of the country has become poorer with his departure. Prof. Rahman expressed heartfelt condolences to his

family particularly his wife Prof. Durdana Qasmi and three sons.

Professor Abdul Latif, Joint Secretary, Ibn Sina Academy, deeply mourned his death and said Qasmi's writings manifest critical and analytical insights in lucid prose. He was an erudite scholar, celebrated critic and an excellent teacher who was extremely popular with research scholars and students.

Trustee and Treasurer, Ibn Sina Academy, Prof. Syed Ziaur Rahman, said "Professor Abul Kalam Qasmi was a widely acclaimed critic and author and was the recipient of many prestigious awards. He bagged the prestigious Sahitya Academy Award on his book "Maasir Tanqeedi Rawaiye". Besides, Ghalib Award, UP Urdu Academy Award, Bihar Urdu Academy Award, and Imtiyaz-e-Meer Award were also bestowed upon him for his seminal works. Professor Qasmi wrote more than a dozen books and scores of articles on different genres of literature. His writings blazed a new trail in Urdu criticism.

Abul Kalam Qasmi (20 December 1950 – 8 July 2021) was an Indian scholar, critic, and poet in the Urdu language who served as the Dean of the Faculty of Arts at the Aligarh Muslim University. He was the editor of *Tehzeeb-ul-Akhlaq* and authored books such as *The Criticism of Poetry*. He translated E. M. Forster's *Aspects of the Novel* into Urdu as *Novel ka Fun*. He was conferred with the Sahitya Akademi Award in 2009, and the Ghalib Award in 2013.

Qasmi was an alumnus of the Darul Uloom Deoband, Jamia Millia Islamia and the Aligarh Muslim University. He served as the Chairman, Department of Urdu, Aligarh Muslim University from 16 June 1996 to 15 June 1999. He also served as the Dean of the AMU's Faculty of Arts. He was considered a major pillar of Urdu criticism.

Abul Kalam Qasmi was born on 20 December 1950 in Darbhanga, Bihar. He received his primary education at Madrasa Qasim al-Ulūm Hussainiya, and graduated in the *dars-e-*

nizami from the Darul Uloom Deoband in 1967. He did his intermediate studies at the Jamia Millia Islamia and received B.A. and M.A. from the Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) in 1973 and 1975 respectively. His teachers included Anzar Shah Kashmiri.

Qasmi became a lecturer at the AMU in 1976 and was appointed a Reader in 1984, the same year he received his PhD degree. He compiled two course books for the university's Urdu department in 1980. In 1993, he was appointed as professor of comparative literature. He edited the *Aligarh Magazine* during 1975 and 1976 and served as the chief-editor of two-monthly magazine *Alfāz, Aligarh* from 1976 to 1980. Between 1983 and 1985, he was the chief-editor of *Inkār, Aligarh*. In 1996, he became the editor of *Tehzeeb-ul-Akhlaq*. He was a member of the Executive Council of the National Council for Promotion of Urdu Language from 1998 to 2003.

Mujawir Husain Rizvi, who was a professor of Urdu literature at the University of Allahabad, would call him as the "Father of the Pen" (Abul Qalam), for his literary contributions. Qasmi was considered a major pillar of Urdu criticism after Gopi Chand Narang and Shamsur Rahman Faruqi. He received the Bihar Urdu Academy Award in 1980, and the Uttar Pradesh Urdu Academy Award in 1987 and 1993. He was conferred with the Sahitya Akademi Award in 2009 and the Ghalib Award in 2013. He died on 8 July 2021 in Aligarh. Tariq Mansoor expressed sorrow and termed his death as a big loss to the literary fraternity of India.

Literary works

Qāsmi translated E. M. Forster's *Aspects of the Novel* into Urdu as *Novel ka Fun*. He authored books such as *Kaṣrat-i Ta'bir, Mashriqi She'riyat aur Urdu Tanqīd ki Riwayat, Shā'iri ki Tanqīd (The Criticism of Poetry)* and *Takhliqi Tajruba*. In January 2010, Qāsmi had 125 research articles in his credit. His compiled works include:

- *Azādī ke ba'd Urdū tanz-o-mizāh*
- *Mashriq kī bāzyāft: Muḥammad Ḥasan 'Askarī ke ḥavāle se* (The Recovery of the

East, with Reference to Muhammad Hasan Askari)

- *Rashīd Aḥmad Ṣiddīqī, shakhṣiyat aur adabī qadr-o-qīmat* (Rasheed Ahmad Siddiqui, Life and His Literary Importance)
- *Mirzā Ghālib: Shakhṣiyat aur Shā'iri* (Mirza Ghalib: Personality and Poetry)

Condolence on the demise of Prof. S. H. Afaq

Professor Saadul Hasan Afaq, who retired from the Department of Ilmul Advia, Ajmal Khan Tibbiya College, AMU in 2013, expired on 16.7.2021 after brain stroke at New Delhi. He was laid to rest at the University graveyard. He is survived by wife, a son and a daughter.

In the condolence meeting, President of Ibn Sina Academy, Prof. Syed Zillur Rahman, said that he and Prof. S. H. Afaq was got appointment at the Department of Ilmul Advia, together in the year 1973. He joined AMU as a lecturer and myself as Reader. Since then, we worked together in the Department and it was a long association with him. He further stated that he was a very good teacher and researcher, and was widely respected in academic circles. He prayed for the departed soul. May his family including his brother brother Prof. S. H. Arif get the patience to this loss.

Prof. S. H. Afaq served as Provost, Viqarul Mulk Hall of AMU; President, Badminton Club, and also as Joint Secretary, AMU Teachers' Association. He was 73 years old.

International Webinar - Maulvi Syed Zainul Abidin

The second international webinar on the life and contributions of Maulvi Syed Zainul Abidin (14th June 1832 - 27th Sep 1905) was organized on the occasion of his birth celebrations, i.e., 14th June 2021. Speaking at the Presidential Address, Padma Shri Prof Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman has emphasized the need to complete his biography on priority which was in process since the first webinar that was organized in 2020. Professor Emeritus, Abdul Haq highlighted the contributions of Machli Shaher, the native place of Zainul Abidin. Professor Naushaba Siddiqui, Principal Allama Iqbal Degree College, Karachi (Pakistan) shared valuable information related to Ghazipur where both Sir Syed and Zainul Abidin were posted in their professional life. Dr. Tayyaba Abidin Qidwai from the USA presented a brief report on the family history (*Shajra*). Professor Saud Alam Qasmi, Professor Syed Hashim, Professor Mohammad Ali Jauhar and Professor Saghir Afraheim were other distinguished speakers.

Haatim Zakiyuddin showed all important manuscripts and other books to Dr. Rahman. The library is famous as the hub of Isma'ili-Tayyibi branch of Learning as it houses the Islamic personal library of rare books and unique personal collection of manuscripts pertaining to Isma'ili Tayyibi literature.

Haatim Zakiyuddin himself manages the library affairs. This centre of ad-Da'wat ul-Haadiyat ul- 'Alaviyah houses several hundred manuscripts which is managed, preserved, conserved, and enriched by the 45th Da'i al-Mutlaq Haatim Zakiyuddin. This personal library contains some of the rare Islamic and Isma'ili titles.

Since the collection is under the direct access, supervision, and control of the Da'i al-Mutlaq and therefore the nature and process of addition to the collection is also noteworthy and the fact is that the Da'i being the sole authority of Isma'ili-Taiyebi learning is cognizant of the contents of each and every manuscript, old as well as recent ones. It has been observed that due to the maintenance of secrecy of Isma'ili Literature, the private family collections in Yemen, Sindh, and Hind are never in direct access to the public domain nor are the manuscripts lent or shared to any aspirant of the study. But, regarding the ad-Da'wat ul-Haadiyat ul-'Alaviyah collection, despite its original and unique source, the Da'i is lenient in sharing the manuscripts after thoroughly assessing the just and critical way of translating, editing and publishing.

Though the centre of 'Alavi Da'wat does not directly invite scholars or researchers from foreign universities, time and again many interested foreign scholars have come straightforwardly and studied Isma'ili titles with the Da'i himself from Iran, the United Kingdom, the United States, and Europe.

At times, when the scholars who worked for the critical study and edition of any Isma'ili title might be having only two to three manuscripts from different origins, i.e., where the writer, place and period differ, there arose the demand for the consultation of more manuscripts. For this purpose, the manuscripts of the 'Alavi Da'wat collection, because of its Indian origin, proved more fruitful for better text reading and editing. The other salient feature of the 'Alavi Library is that it is housed at the Da'i's residence and most of the manuscripts are copied by the Du'aat from those which were brought to Vadodara when the Da'wat headquarters were shifted from Ahmedabad.

It has been well-preserved and well-maintained by the Da'i's great efforts. Like many other places where such manuscripts were bundled for centuries and remained under lock-and-key and were never referred to or studied, the case is entirely different here. At the 'Alavi Library, the Da'i consults and refers to these manuscripts and accordingly copies its texts in individual papers for lecturing purposes and hands over certain old manuscripts to his close aides to make a fresh copy by penning the entire text. With age-old methods the preservation of the manuscripts is carried out. As the *Da'i* personally handles all library affairs, the question of precaution, curing, or fumigation never arises. But the Du'aat felt it compulsory to make a copy of every manuscript as there was a constant fear of a single copy being damaged by any unexpected accident or worm attack. Every year more and more manuscripts are added to the collection and also, they are copied as and when required.

On behalf of Ibn Sina Academy, Dr. Rahman invited Haatim Zakiyuddin for the next Ibn

Sina Memorial Lecture. He also requested to present a copy of the manuscript scribed by his own hand on any work of Ibn Sina. 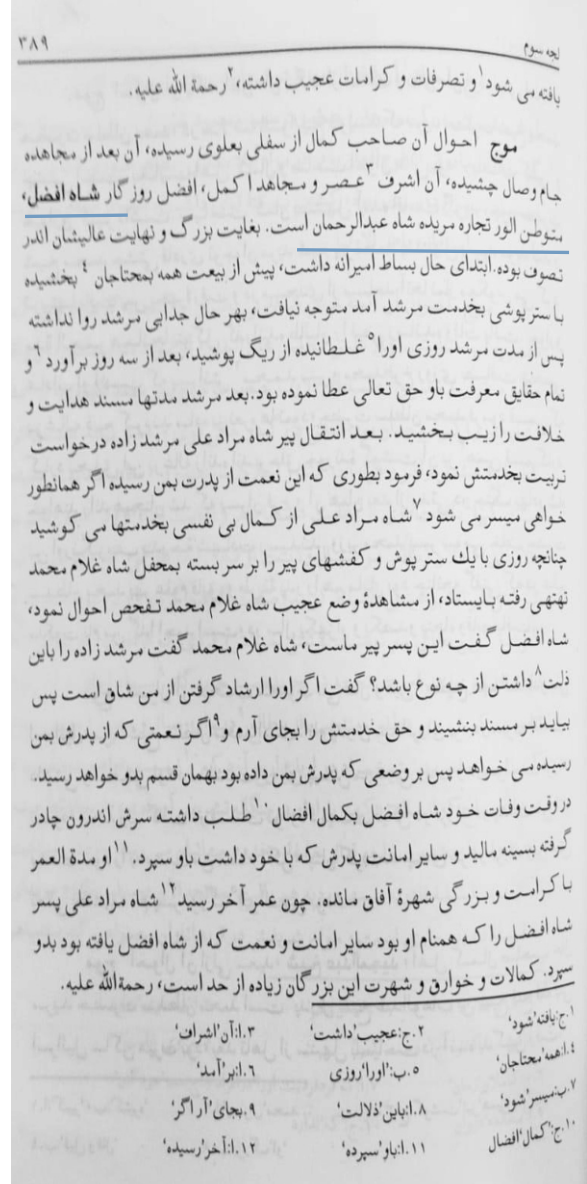
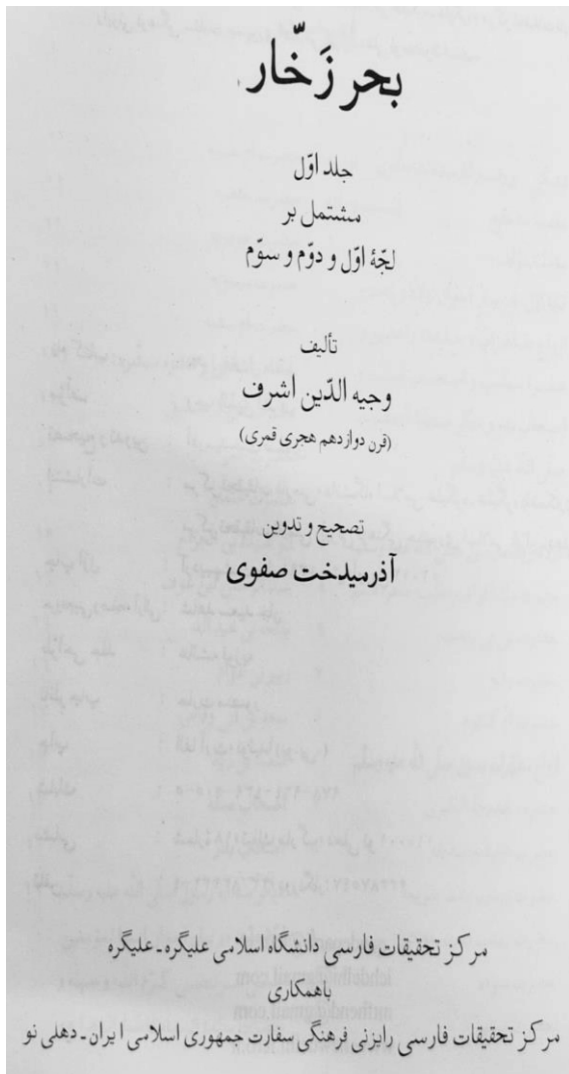
“Bahar-e Zakhkhar”

The Historical Russia

On my recent visit to Russia, I was fascinated to see the historical side of the country. I am here to share some of my experiences of my amazing visits to the museums exploring more about the country's culture and past.

The first city to explore was the capital of the country, Moscow which is also the largest city of Russia. We chose to stay in the central area where the famous Red Square was close by.

Red Square is the most visited attraction in the city and one can refer it to as the heart and soul of Moscow. This place in itself represents the history of Russia which is surrounded by remarkable sites such as Kremlin, St. Basil's Cathedral, The State Historical Museum.

Kremlin symbolizes both Russian and Soviet power and authority and is the official residence of the president of the Russian Federation since 1991.

St. Basil's Cathedral is an orthodox church built in the 16th century now which is a museum of architecture, history, politics and religion and is Russia's one of the most popular cultural symbols. The spectacular view of the cathedral captures one's attention by its magnificent combination of colours, patterns and shapes. In the beginning of the 20th century, it merged with the State Historical Museum. In 1990, UNESCO declared it as a World Heritage Site along with the entire Kremlin.

Bolshoi Theatre is a historic theatre in Moscow which is more than 240 years old, remains one of the most significant theatres to see ballet and opera in the world.

Vadim Zadorozhny Vehicle Museum is one of the largest private antique vehicle museums in Europe and the largest one is situated in Russia. It had the best collection of antique vehicles of the past century, military equipment, weapons, airplanes, motorcycles and retro automobiles.

One of my visits to the most sacred places of Russia is **The Holy Trinity St. Sergius Lavra**. It is the largest monastery of the Russian Orthodox Church founded in the first half of the 14th century is a popular site of pilgrimage and tourism. Currently, there are over 200 monks serving and working at the

monastery and is listed as UNESCO Site of World Heritage.

The second city to explore was Saint Petersburg, one of my favourite places in the world which has a breathtaking beauty of its own and is full of cultural, historical and architectural landmarks. It is a magical city which has a lot to offer. Some of the important landmarks that I visited are listed below.

The **State Hermitage Museum** is one of the largest art museums in the world. The museum is within 5 interconnected buildings that includes the Winter Palace, and the buildings of Small, Old and New Hermitages and the Hermitage theatre. The museum complex also includes the Menshikov Palace and the Eastern Wing of the General Staff building, the Staraya Derevnya Restoration and Storage Centre and the Museum of the Imperial Porcelain Factory. The Hermitage exhibits over 3 million items representing antiquity, Western Europe, Middle East, Russia and may more epochs, countries and regions.

The **State Museum St. Isaac's Cathedral** is the largest orthodox church and the 4th largest cathedral in the world. It is an iron-domed cathedral which took about 40 years (1818 – 1858) to complete its construction. The visitors are offered 300 steps climb up to the rotunda of the dome to witness a spectacular 360-degree view of the beautiful city.

Grand Peterhof Palace was built in 1714 as a summer residence for the Russian royalty and honours their victory in Great Northern War. It is a unique historical and art museum exhibiting collections that includes furniture, paintings, fabrics, lighting, porcelain that caters the taste of the royal owners of the Palace. The Palace is surrounded by beautiful gardens, statues and fountains which worth a visit for sure.

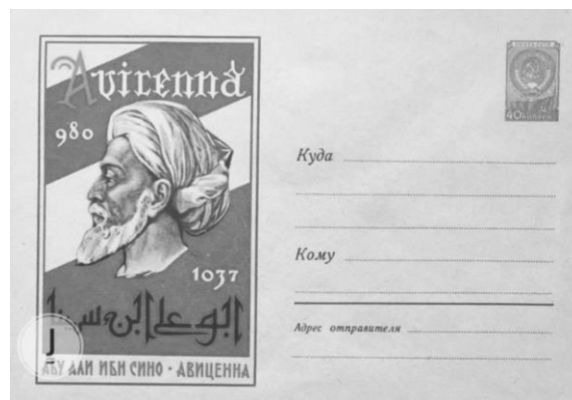
Church of the Saviour on Spilled Blood is a former Russian orthodox church which is now functioning as a secular museum, was built in the memory of Alexander II who was assassinated in 1881. It is a museum of

mosaics and is one of the main tourist attractions in St. Petersburg.

The third and the last city to visit was Bryansk where the **Svensky Monastery** was located at the confluence of Desna and Sven rivers about three miles from Bryansk. It is a Russian Orthodox Monastery founded in 1288.

With this I end my beautiful trip to Russia keeping the everlasting memories in my heart, hoping to be back sometime sooner.

The Central Council for Research in Unani Medicine (CCRUM) is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. It was established on 30 March 1978; however, it started functioning in January 1979. Since inception, the Council has been busy in researching various fundamental and applied aspects of Unani Medicine. Over the years, the CCRUM has emerged as the world-leader in the field of research in Unani Medicine.

THE NETWORK

The CCRUM has 23 research centers functioning in different parts of the country, besides its headquarters in New Delhi.

AREAS OF ACTIVITY

The Research Programme of the Council has four major components:

- Clinical Research
- Drug Standardization
- Literary Research
- Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Some of the significant achievements of the Council are as follows:

Clinical Research

- Developed 27 Unani drugs, which are purely natural, standardized and without any side-effects, for successful treatment of vitiligo, sinusitis, infective hepatitis, eczema, filariasis, malaria, rheumatoid arthritis, bronchial asthma and some other common ailments.
- Obtained 15 patents on for developing certain novel therapeutic compositions and SCAR primers.



Drug Standardization

- Developed pharmacopoeial standards for 298 single and 150 compound drugs. Besides, Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for manufacture of 50 compound drugs have also been finalized.
- Published six volumes of *National Formulary of Unani Medicine*, six volumes of *Unani Pharmacopoeia of India (UPI)*, Part 1 (on single drugs), and three volumes of the UPI, Part 2 (on compound drugs).

Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants

- Collected over 104,568 specimens of medicinal plants belonging to 1,800 species from the wild.
- Undertaken successful cultivation of 33 important medicinal species.
- Gathered and documented over 16,261 folk medicinal claims.

Literary Research

- Translated 56 volumes of 21 classical books/manuscripts from Arabic/Persian into Urdu and other languages.
- Prepared a database of 2,400 manuscripts of Unani Medicine.
- Reprinted over 70 rare classical books.
- Compiled Standard Unani Medical Terminology for 4,028 terms of Unani Medicine.
- Developed 'Standard Unani Treatment Guidelines for Common Diseases'.

Publications

- Produced over 2,000 research papers and brought out about 400 publications, besides regular publication of a quarterly bulletin *CCRUM Newsletter*, quarterly Urdu Journal *Jahan-e-Tib* and quarterly English Journal *Hippocratic Journal of Unani Medicine*.
