Established in 1978, the CCRUM started functioning from 10 January, 1979, and ever since it has been busy researching into various fundamental and applied aspects of Unani Medicine. Over the years, the CCRUM has emerged as the world-leader in the field.

THE AREAS OF ACTIVITY

The Research Programme of the Council has four major components:

* Clinical Research * Drug Standardization * Literary Research * Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants THE MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Some significant achievements of the Council are as follows:



CLINICAL RESEARCH

- Has developed 24 Unani Drugs which are purely natural, standardized and without any side-effects, for successful treatment of leucoderma, sinusitis, viral hepatitis, eczema, malaria, rheumatoid, arthritis and bronchial asthma.
- · Has filed patents on seven of these drugs.

DRUG STANDARDIZATION

- Has evolved standards for 222 single and 385 compound Unani drugs.
- Has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) for taking up advanced research in the field of drug development

LITERARY RESEARCH

 Has translated from Arabic and Persian into Urdu language 25 Unani Medical Classics mostly manuscripts. And has edited and published these works.

SURVEY & CULTIVATION OF MEDICINAL PLANTS

- Has collected 59462 specimens of 1730 medicinal plants from the wild
- Undertaking successful cultivation of four important medicinal species
- Has gathered and documented 6650 folk medicinal claims

PUBLICATIONS

 Has produced over 1000 research papers and brought out 116 research publications, besides regular publications of a bimonthly CCRUM Newsletter, Quarterly Urdu Journal Jahan-e-Tib and Annual Report.

GUEST LECTURE BY PROFESSOR MOINUDDIN AQEEL

Professor Moinuddin Ageel delivered a lecture on "New Dimensions of Islamic Thoughts" at 6:30 PM on March 1, 2008 at the Library Hall of Ibn Sînâ Academy. Prof. H. S. Zillur Rahman, President of the Academy, after welcoming the guests. briefed about Prof. Ageel as follows. " Prof. Moinuddin Ageel possesses a remarkable prominence of being among the most eminent scholars and writers of Urdu Literature and South Asia Muslim Culture. He has a distinguished academic records and citations. Born in 1946, he secured his PhD (1975) and DLitt (2003) degrees from Karachi University (Pakistan). A prolific researcher, he traveled vastly, almost in 40 major countries, and visited important institutions and libraries. He authored, edited and compiled 37 books, hundreds of learned papers and articles in national and journals, renowned internationally encyclopaedias and scholarly compendia. He had been also a visiting professor at the universities of Naples and Tokyo".

In his lecture, Prof. Aqeel traced the efforts to 'reconstruct' the Islamic thought, particularly on the subcontinent. Starting from Shah Waliullah, down to Lutfullah, Sir Sayed, Dr. Mohammad Iqbal, Prof. Aqeel emphasized the efforts of many Indian *Ulemâ* in this connection, particularly the work of renowned jurist, A. A. A. Faizi. The quintessence of his thesis was that in the

modern socio-cultural milieu, a new exegesis of Islamic thought in general, and even that of the Prophetic traditions (the Hadîth) in particular is imperative and decisively needed.

Prof. Abul Kalam Qasmi, Dean Faculty of Arts, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, presided over the function. Prof. Masoodul Hasan, Prof. Ishrat Farooqui, Prof S. M. Razaullah Ansari, Prof. Iqtidar Hussain Siddiqui, Dr. Habib Raza also took part in the deliberations. A large number of University teachers and students attended the program.

BOOK RELEASING CEREMONY

A book releasing ceremony of Parvin Shere was organized on January 16, 2008. Prof. Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman, President, Ibn Sînâ Academy, welcomed the guests. While introducing Parvin Shere, he said Parvin Shere is from Winnipeg (Canada) and is a renowned artist, poet and musician. She formally developed her talent of paintings at the Fine Arts Program, University of Manitoba, Canada. Her extensive travel throughout Europe and particularly in developing countries triggered in her a need to enlighten about the dualistic nature of this world. The oppressed has a profound effect on her work. Her visual art has been shown extensively in Canada, USA, England, France and India. Her work is displayed in prominent public and collections internationally. She has received several awards for her paintings. She was one of the five nominees honoured during the prestigious "Women of Distinction Awards" for her contribution in Art, Culture and Heritage in Winnepeg, Canada. She has composed CD's of poetry and music for help raise funds for UNICEF to globally. underprivileged children addition to the organ and banjo, she plays the sitar, one of the most ancient and

difficult instruments. She currently serves on the Film Classification Board in Manitoba, Canada.

Her new edition of the collection of poems and paintings namely *Kircheeyan* (Fragments) was released by famous Urdu Novelist Prof Qazi Abdussatar. In his presidential address, he said Parvin's work demonstrates her love for humanity that leads to spiritual satisfaction and is brilliantly expressed in her paintings as well as in poetry. She combines her writing and paintings to reflect on our mortal lives and the world that surrounds us.

Parvin Shere then presented some parts of her *ghazals* and *nazms*. She also showed related paintings mentioned in her collection of poems "*Kircheeyan*". She also expressed her views about her relationship with Urdu language and literature and read out some other stanzas from her poetry. She informed, the profit from the sale of her book *Kircheeyan* will be donated to underprivileged children.

Students receive money in the form of dinning hall charges ranging 3-5 months and their dues are paid through Finance Office, AMU. Only NRSC students received award in cash (given by the respective provosts). A total amount of around \$9106 has been sanctioned for this year, Dr. Mozaffarul Islam in a function held

at Ibn Sînâ Academy on March 2, 2008 delivered the award letters this year. Dr. M. Islam is a Vice-President of AMU Alumni Association of Michigan, USA.

Prof. Syed Zillur Rahman (President, IAMMS) was invited as expert, Public Commission, Allahabad, Service January - 2nd February 2008. Prof. S.M. Razaullah Ansari (Secretary, Ibn Sīnā Academy) was offered a fellowship by Alexander von Humboldt Foundation, Bonn (Germany) to work for three months (July-Sept.2007) at the Institute of History of Science, University of Frankfurt (Germany). Prof. Ansari has edited the Persian Text of Zij-i Muhammad Shāhī, the astronomical-mathematical Tables compiled under the supervision of maharaja Jai Singh II (d.1743). He finalized at Frankfurt the English translation of the Text, using resources extant at the Institute.

Prof. K. C. Singhal (Hony Member, CSRUISM, IAMMS) has been appointed as vice-chancellor of a newly created NIMS University at Jaipur. NIMS, which was established decade back stands for National Institute of Medical Science comprises now a large educational campus and runs many medical and paramedical courses along with those in engineering and management. After getting the status of deemed university, NIMS under the able guidance of Prof Singhal, will further progress in near future. Prof. KC Singhal after graduation and post graduation from KGMC (Lucknow) started his career as an assistant research officer in a project of ICMR in 1968 at JNMC (Aligarh Muslim University). He was appointed lecturer on May 15, 1968 and subsequently reader and also many He held professor. administrative posts at Aligarh both in the university and outside in the Aligarh city life. He has made extensive and significant contributions in the field of established pharmacology. He methods for screening Antifilarial agents using Setaria cervi as test organism. Being one of the foremost pioneers in the field of Indian pharmacovigilance, he founded the Society of Pharmacovigilance, India (SoPI). He has been a founding Fellow of Indian Society (IPS), Indian Pharmacological

Academy of Neurosciences (IAN) and IMA Academy of Medical Specialties. He had a member of the executive been committee, treasurer, chief editor and president of IPS; treasurer, secretary and president of IAN; editor (pharmacology) of APPI Journal; member editorial board of various journals including Annals of Neuroscience of IAN. He is a recipient of many awards including BC Sharma Memorial Research Award of IMA, SS Parmar Foundation Award of IAN, B Mukherjee Prize of IPS, Major General SL Bhatia Oration Award of APPI, Col. RN Chopra Oration Award of IPS, Platinum Jubilee Oration Award of ISCA, G. Achari Oration Award of IPS, John Autian Oration of SoPI, Life Time Achievement Award of He was internationally etc. recognized when he was invited as visiting professor at the University of Tennessee (Memphis, USA) and as an honorary consultant, WHO Collaborating Centre for International Drug Monitoring (Uppsala, Sweden).

Inaugural Conference of the International Society for Cultural History The study of culture - whether it be from a regional, a national or a more global perspective - has been central to the humanities for at least two decades now. In this period, we have seen the rise of several disciplinary movements within this ever-expanding domain of Cultural studies, cultural criticism, cultural analysis and cultural anthropology are some of the more persistent labels to have been put forward in an attempt to describe and reorganise the field. Given the fact that the study of cultural artifacts and practices nowadays often steers a distinct historical course, the label of cultural history could be proposed as a sort of umbrella-term, comprising the previous ones. But is it, really?

At this four-day event - the inaugural assembly of the International Society for Cultural History that was founded at a successful conference on cultural history in Aberdeen in July 2007 - we want to address a series of fundamental questions about the recent impact and the near future of diverse forms of cultural history. Taking its cue from the fundamental work of, among others, Catherine Belsey, Peter Burke, Lynn Hunt, and Philippe Poirrier, the conference will tackle the vexing question of the precise nature of cultural history. Which disciplinary models and/or critical paradigms can be brought together under this label? Do we actually need such a unifying label? If we do, then what exactly do we understand by it? Are there different, 'national' (British, French, German, Italian, Finnish...) forms of cultural history and what distinguishes them from one another? How does one teach cultural history and what does one teach when one teaches cultural history?

The organisers of this conference welcome papers (theoretical, practical or a combination

of both) that will enable us to formulate answers to the questions listed above, but also to other issues concerning future "orientations" of the field of cultural history. Where does the field stand, and where is it heading to? How does it relate to other academic disciplines both within and outside the humanities? The label of cultural history is a slippery one, consisting of two no less slippery concepts - culture and history. The past few decades have witnessed fierce methodological debates concerning the latter term, debates theory and practice about the about historicism historiography, presentism, about the irretrievable loss of the past and its stubborn presence, about history and memory, about historical traumas and ways of overcoming them. Did these and other historiographical debates in any way alter the domain of cultural history? Is cultural history a specific brand of history, in terms of the topics that it studies or does it, rather, involve a distinct methodology that sets it apart from other historical disciplines? Should we take cultural history as something different from political history, religious history, the history of science, the history of medicine, the history of art and literature, or does it comprise all of the above? If it does, what are the professional expectations with which cultural historians find themselves confronted? Are they supposed be true homines and feminae universales or, rather, amateurs, in the positive sense of that word? And what about the inter- or multidisciplinary nature of cultural history?

Apart from proposals tackling disciplinary issues like the above ones, the organisers also very much welcome papers that bring cultural history into practice. Alain Corbin's book on Louis-François Pinagot e.g. (The life of an unknown, Columbia UP, 2001), dealt both with the methodological difficulties of a cultural historian – how to

In addition, each applicant must ask two recognized scholars to submit letters of support through the same web site by the same deadline.

Applications for Visiting Dissertation Fellowships must list the specific PACHS members' collections that will be used and describe the relevance of these collections to their projects. A panel of independent distinguished scholars will evaluate the proposals.

PACHS is a consortium of eleven cultural and educational institutions: the Academy American the Sciences. Natural of the Chemical Society, Philosophical . the College of Heritage Foundation, Physicians of Philadelphia, the Franklin Institute, the Hagley Museum and Library, the Historical Society of Pennsylvania, the Library Company of Philadelphia, Princeton University, the University of Pennsylvania,

and the Wagner Free Institute of Science.
