THE NETWORK


20 research Centres of the Council are functioning in different parts of the Country.

THE AREAS OF ACTIVITY

The Research Programme of the Council has four major components:

*Clinical Research *Drug Standardization *Literary Research *Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants THE MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Some significant achievements of the Council are as follows:



CLINICAL RESEARCH

- Has developed 24 Unani Drugs which are purely natural, standardized and without any side-effects, for successful treatment of leucoderma, sinusitis, viral hepatitis, eczema, malaria, rheumatoid, arthritis and bronchial asthma.
- Has filed patents on seven of these drugs.

DRUG STANDARDIZATION

- Has evolved standards for 222 single and 385 compound Unani drugs.
- Has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) for taking up advanced research in the field of drug development

LITERARY RESEARCH

Has translated from Arabic and Persian into Urdu language 25 Unani Medical Classics mostly manuscripts. And has edited and published these works.

SURVEY & CULTIVATION OF MEDICINAL PLANTS

- Has collected 59462 specimens of 1730 medicinal plants from the wild
- Undertaking successful cultivation of four important medicinal species
- Has gathered and documented 6650 folk medicinal claims

PUBLICATIONS

Has produced over 1000 research papers and brought out 116 research publications, besides regular publications of a bimonthly CCRUM Newsletter, Quarterly Urdu Journal Jahan-e-Tib and Annual Report.

ACTIVITIES AT IBN SINA ACADEMY

OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY (......A day to acknowledge individual loss and family grief when loved ones have suffered overdose)

The Academy organized the "Overdose Awareness Day" on 31st August 2008 to remember those who have died or are suffering permanent injury from drug overdose under the chairmanship of Prof. M. Ashraf Malik (Principal & Chief Medical Superintendent of Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College & Hospital, AMU, Aligarh).

Dr. Asad U. Khan* delivered the keynote lecture on medico-social aspect of overdoses. He highlighted and discussed the epidemiology, physiology, signs and symptoms and legal status of various drugs' overdose particularly opiates with all possible measures and antidotes to preventing fatal overdose – SKOOP (Skills and Knowledge on Overdose Prevention).

Dr. M. Tauheed Ahmad presented a self composed poetry**. Dr. Md Tauheed Ahmad. Circulation Officer, NISA Resident, Department of Community Medicine, J. N. Medical College, AMU, Aligarh, is an award winning poet. His first collection of poems was published in 2006. His is also the author of Project Poetry To Combat Tobacco (PTCT), which is a collection of poems focused on breaking the vicious positive image attached to tobacco.

Medical students of JN Medical College (Yasir Alvi, Nusrat, Raunaque, Sadaf Hayat, Aaliya Ehsan, Amrin, Naghma, Shairin) organized posters exhibition on many facets of drug overdoses.

Prof. M. Ashraf Malik while presiding over the function, stressed the need of such

awareness programme for common people of all walks of life, he also laid the stress on the role of NGOs in spreading such messages and promised to cooperate himself in such endeavors.

Dr. Syed Ziaur Rahman, Chief Organizer of the even, while conducting the programme, "drug said, overdose may occur accidentally, intentionally or for suicidal reasons. Both 'drugs of abuse' and 'therapeutic medicines' are responsible for toxicity. overdose Medically, reasons, such as genetic, accumulation of drugs and their metabolites in the body, long duration of drug exposure, and in any pathological conditions mainly of liver and kidney disorders, are also responsible for drug overdose".

The programme was a part of the project of the Salvation Army Crisis Service, Australia. Participants shall wear "Silver Badges" of the Salvation Army that signify the profound loss of someone cherished.

*Dr. Khan is a senior lecturer in the Interdisciplinary Biotechnology Unit of Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh. He has been a Postdoctoral Research Fellow & Research Associate at the Department of Wood Biochemistry, Robert Medical School, UMDNJ, Piscataway, NJ. USA. He also worked as Visiting Scientist. Department of Microbiology and Preventive Medicine, University of Napoli; Fedrico II; Napoli, Italy). He is a recipient of Young Scientist Project of Department of Science Technology, Young Scientist Award of Association of Microbiologist of India in **National** Microbiology, Indian Medical Science Academic Visiting Fellowship, BOYSCAST Fellowship of Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, New Delhi. He is a reviewer of several scientific manuscripts submitted in the area of clinical microbiology and Molecular biology for the publication in peer reviewed international journals. On 16th February, 2008, in an emergency meeting, Darul Musannefin Shibli Academy has appointed Prof. Ishtiyaq Ahmad Zilli as its new Secretary & Director. Prof. Ishiyaq Ahmad Zilli had served in the department of History, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh till 2004. His experience and qualities will help Darul Musannefin Shibli Academy to regain its past glory. The position was vacant after the accidental death of Maulana Ziauddin Islahi, on 2nd February 2008. This is a rare event when someone from outside of Darul Musannefin took the leadership responsibilities. Most of the recent past Secretaries & Directors were Musannefin originally Darul research scholars like Maulana Shah Moinuddin Maulana Sabahuddin Abdur Rahman and Maulana Ziauddn Islahi.

Prof. Ishtiyaq Ahmad Zilli was born on 2nd May 1942 in a small village "Chhaun" of Azamgarh (UP). After completing his Fazilat from Madarsatul Islah, Saraimir, Azamgarh in 1962, he joined the University of Medina for a brief period. Later he joined from where University Lucknow completed his B.A. in 1966 and took admission in Aligarh Muslim University in M.A. After completing his MA in 1968, he was appointed as Research Associate in the Department of History, AMU Aligarh. During that period, he completed his M.Phil in 1969. He was a resident of Hasrat Mohani Hostel in Sulaiman Hall. He completed his Ph.D. in 1978 from AMU, Aligarh, From 1990-91, he had also served as Provost of Mohammad Habib Hall, AMU, Aligarh. In 2000, he was appointed as Professor in the Department of History. He retired from the Department of History in 2004 and lives in Aligarh with his family.

Prof. Zilli is a respected scholar of Quran and Founding President of Idarah Uloom

Al-Quran, Aligarh since 1984. He is also Editor of biannual journal Uloom Al-Quran which is published by Idarah Uloom Al-Quran. He is a member of the management committee of Darul Musannefin Shibli Academy since 2000, Association for the Study of Persianate Societies (ASPS), Iranology Foundation, Tehran. He is on board of editorial of the Journal of Persianate Studies to be launched soon from E. J. Brill, Leiden. He was invited to present paper . and talk to various universities such Georgetown University in Washington D.C. (Holland), Leiden University (USA), Tangiers (Morocco), Dushanbe (Tajikistan) and Tehran (Iran). In June 2007, he attended the 3rd Biennial Convention of Association for the Study of Persianate Societies (ASPS) in Tiflis-Georgia. November 2006. University of Chicago invited him to deliver a talk on Shibli - his role in Muslim League.

ARTICLE ON IBN SÎNÂ

Not long after Al-Razi's death, Ibn Sina (980-1037) was born in Bukhara in what today is Uzbekistan. Later translators Latinized his name to Avicenna. It is hard to describe Ibn Sina in anything other than superlatives. He was to the Arab world what Aristotle was to Greece, Leonardo da Vinci to theRenaissance, and Goethe to Germany. His preeminene embraced not only medicine, but also the fields of philosophy, science, music, poetry, and statecraft. His contemporaries called him "the prince of physicians."

Ibn Sina's life was in fact the stuff of legend. The son of a tax collector, he was so precocious that he had completely memorized the Qur'an by age 10. Then he

studied law, mathematics, physics, and philosophy. Confronted by a difficult problem in Aristotle's Metaphysics, Ibn Sina re-read the book 40 times in his successful search for a solution. At the age 16, he turned to the study of medicine, which he said he found "not difficult." By the time he was 18, his fame as a physician was so great that he was summoned to treat the Samanid prince Nuh ibn Mansur. His success with that patient won him access to the Samanid royal library, one of the greatest of Bukhara's many storehouses of learning. At the age of 20, Ibn Sina was appointed court physician and twice served as vizier to Shams al-Dawlah, the Buyid prince of Hamadan in western Persia. His remaining years were crowded adventure and hard work, yet he somehow found time to write 20 books on theology. metaphysics astronomy, philology poetry and 20 more on medicine - including Kitab al-Shifa' or The Book of Healing, a medical and philosophical encyclopedia. Ibn Sina's supreme work, however, is the monumental Al-Qanun fi al-Tibb, "The Canon of Medicine." Over one million words long, it was nothing less than a codification ...of existing medical all knowledge. Summarizing the Hippocratic and Galenic traditions, describing Syropractice Indo-Persian Arab and including notes on his own observations, Ibn Sina strove to fit each bit of anatomy, physiology, diagnosis and treatment into its proper niche. The Canon stressed the importance of diet and the influence of climate and environment on health. It included discussions of rabies, hydrocele, breast cancer, tumors, labor, and poisons and their treatment. Ibn Sina differentiated meningitis from the meningismus of other acute diseases; and described chronic nephritis, facial paralysis, ulcer of the stomach and the various types of hepatitis and their causes. He also expounded the dilation and contraction of the pupils and their diagnostic value. He described the six motor muscles of the eye and discussed the functions of the tear ducts. In addition, he noted the contagious nature of some diseases, which he attributed to "traces" left in the air by a sick person.

The Canon also included a description of some 760 medicinal plants and the drugs that could be derived from them. At the same time Ibn Sina laid out the basic rules of clinical drug trials, principles that are still followed today. (side bar Testing New Medicines) Not surprisingly, The Canon rapidly became the standard medical reference work of the Islamic world. Nizamii Arudi of Samarkand spoke for generations of physicians when he wrote, in the early 12th century, "From him who manages the first volume [of The Canon], nothing will be hidden concerning the general theory and principles of medicine." The Canon was used as a reference, a teaching guide and a medical textbook until well into the 19th century, longer than any other medical work.

The library of the Academy at present houses one of the most precious and valuable collection of over 400 medical manuscripts. 17,000 printed books in many languages like Arabic, Persian, Urdu, Sanskrit, Hindu and English, 11,000 periodicals, hundreds of special magazines, medical conference souvenirs and many specimens of oriental calligraphy on medical sciences and the practice of medicine.
