EVENTS AT IBN SINA ACADEMY (April – June 2017)

orld Health Day and Eleventh **Prof. Nasim Ansari Oration** Ibn Sina Academy of Medieval Medicine & and Sciences, Aligarh, was primarily established in 2000, promotion of research and publications on medieval medicine and science with special reference to the works of this period. Consequently, the Academy also organize guest lectures for the benefit of researchers and scholars. Every year on World Health Day (7th April), "Prof. Nasim Ansari Oration" and World Health Day (WHD) Theme Lecture are delivered by eminent personalities.

This year on 7th April 2017, the Academy invited Prof. Vandana Roy (Director Professor and Head Department of Pharmacology, Maulana Azad Medical College, University of Delhi) to deliver the "11th Prof. Nasim Ansari Oration" in the area of History of Pharmacology. She delved the history in detail starting from ancient civilizations to medieval medicine along with recent milestones in the progress of drug development and its molecular designing. While, Dr. Mohd. Amir Usmani (Assistant Professor, Deptt. of Psychiatry, JNMC, AMU, Aligarh) delivered the WHO theme Lecture on "Depression -Let's Talk". He elaborated types of depression and how one can overcome simply by sharing and talking with nears and dears.

Sir Syed Bi-centennial Exhibition

As a part of Sir Syed Bi-centennial Celebrations, the Academy arranged a year long special exhibition, which was inaugurated by the then Vice Chancellor of AMU Lt General Zameer Uddin Shah and Prof. Abdur Raheem Kidwai (Chairman Sir Syed Bi-centennial Celebrations) on 23 December 2016.

Sir Syed Ahmad Khan is a great personality in the Indian subcontinent. Lots of

publications on his personality; comparative studies on his life; critical evaluations of his views on education, social reforms, politics ideas, etc.; letters written by him to his friends and for raisings college funds, came into limelight since his death. He himself wrote many books and edited journals of repute. Old Boys of AMU spread all over the world celebrate his birthday with pomp and gaiety as "Sir Syed Day" and release "Souvenirs". Similarly. lots seminars/conferences were held on his life contributions resulting into publications of these deliberations. Ibn Sina Academy at Aligarh, which is a sort of archive of Medieval Indian culture. holds collections of eminent personalities including Sir Syed. Around 200 published books by Sir Syed and by other scholars on his personality are extant in the Library including Special Sir Syed Numbers of journals. The Academy also possesses all postal stamps and First Day Covers issued on his personality, rare documents. artefacts. photographs, badges, mementoes, invitation cards on programs related to Sir Syed Ahmad Khan. In addition, the Academy has 2 large size shells which were used by Sir Syed as paperweights. Some rare books and periodicals belong to his own period of life, like the file of Tahzibul Akhlag of 1874 and 1875. All such collected items are now displayed in the Exhibition.

On this occasion, Janab Alim Naqvi, wrote an article, Sir Syed aur Ibn Sina Academy, published in many Urdu newspapers.

The District Court, Saket, New Delhi has ordered the Rex Remedies Pvt Ltd not to use a name similar to the word 'Dimagheen' for one of their products since Dawakhana of Tibbiya College, Aligarh Muslim University, has been producing a health product, 'Dimagheen' since 1954. The court has observed that with the use of a name similar to AMU's

product, customers might get confused in between the two products.

While briefing the media about the judgement; Mr Arshad Munir, Manager, Dawakhana Tibbiya College, AMU and Professor Tajuddin, Dawakhana Tibbiya College, AMU today informed that Rex Remedies has been asked to immediately stop using the name similar to 'Dimagheen' in one of their products as it is a patent and registered product of AMU's Dawakhana Tibbiya College.

The case against Rex Remedies was registered at the District Court, Saket in New Delhi after it was found out that the company has been producing a product similar to Dawakhana Tibbiya College's Dimagheen and with a name sounding similar to Tibbiya College's product.

One of the best Regional Research Institutes of Unani Medicine (RRIUM) of CCRUM, Govt. of India at Srinagar. The

institute is currently under the able administrative capability of Dr. Seema Akbar, who's developing and modernising the institute with the grant of DST, Govt. of India. Its toxicology and pharmacology unit is very impressive.

History of the Haqqis by Sumbul Raza

Today I visited Ibn Sina Academy and met Padma Shri Hakim Zillur Rahman. He has founded a treasure trove in the form of the Academy which has a library and a museum. Its a "must" visiting place for all. He is an extremely learned person and enlightened me about many aspects related to my maternal family.

My Maternal Grandfather's name was Prof Syed Anwar ul Haq Haqqi, who traces his roots to Sheikh Abdul Haq Muhaddis Dehlavi. I knew this already because I had asked Abbu, if there was any connection when I came across the name while studying the history during my graduation days.

But the following facts that I came to know today were a revelation.

1. My great grandfather had 2 marriages, his first wife Ummatul Hafeez was the daughter of Qazi Fayyazuddin of Tijara, Alwar. She died during childbirth. So my great grandfather remarried and his second wife bore him 5 sons and 1 daughter.

Ummatul Hafeez. She was the younger sister of Qazi Hameeduddin. They were originally from Tijara, in Alwar, Rajasthan. "The elder daughter Ruggaiya Begum was married to Mufti Mohammad Siddig and had 2 daughters while the younger daughter Hafeez Ummatul was married Mahmoodul Hag ibn Afzalul Hag ibn Munshi Barkat Ali ibn Khairat Ali of Palwal and had no children. With second wife, Mahmoodul Hag had two sons namely Maulana Abrarul Hag (caliph of Ashraf Ali Thanwi) and Professor Anwarul Hag. They were all scholars of their times.

Earliest books, 'Miratul Hagaig' and 'Kitab Rahnuma-i Hujjaj' in their family extant even today were written by Munshi Barkat Ali. Khairat Ali and Hayat Ali were two prominent brothers settled in Palwal and sons of Hasan Ali Mohammad bin Kamaluddin. Khairat Ali was Sarishtedar of Deputy Commissioner of Gurgaon, who later on joined the services at the court of Raja of Tijara. He died in Tijara but his body was taken to Delhi for burial near the grave of Shaikh Abdul Haq Mohaddis. Hayat Ali was Thanedar at Shahdara (Delhi)."

2. My maternal ancestors were originally Turks who settled in Delhi but later some of them moved to Palwal, Hardoi and Bhopal.

"During the British period, Palwal was a part of the Punjab Province and a part of Gurgaon district. Many persons from Palwal participated the 1857 in revolt against the British forces. Hayat Ali and Khairat Ali were martyred along with 17 people from Palwal only. Hayat Ali after arrest from his house was taken to Delhi and hanged. All male members of his family were ordered to be hanged. Large number arrest warrants were issued. Interestingly, Tahsildar Palwal impersonated as Bangle seller like a Political decoy, went to the house of Hayat Ali, and saved Nazeer Ali (the grandson of Hayat Ali), who was merely 2 years old inside a basket fully covered by bangles. He then left the child in the jungles of Nageena near Palwal. Ladies from the family of Hayat Ali, followed him, took the child from jungles and with cautious ultimately reached Tijara. Amongst the 17 people who were hanged in Palwal included the son-in-law of Hayat Ali, whose name was Iradat Ali bin Rustam Ali. When British forces chased the other family members from Pinangwan. The brother of Iradat Ali from Pinangwan, namely Karamat Ali could able to survive his life and ran away to Tijara."

3. I never knew they were freedom fighters and were later hanged.

This is the information I have right now. Prof Rahman's book, Hayat-e Karam Husain has a much more detailed *Shajrah* or genealogical chart which I am yet to read. All the Haqqis are requested to please add their names and any other information that they may have.

OBITUARIES

Jamuna Prasad Rahi

Very sad to inform about the sudden demise of Jamuna Prasad Rahi, a regular visitor of Ibn Sina Academy and involved its all literary activities. Participated in several "Urdu poetry recitals" being organised in association with "Ghalib Study Centre". His book, "Baazgasht-e Ghalib", was published by 'Ghalib Study Centre' of Ibn Sina Academy. The Academy will miss him in its cultural and literary activities, said by Prof Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman.

Jamuna Prasad Raahi (1940-2017), a prominent Urdu poet, who devoted whole of his life for the love of Urdu language, was fondly remembered at a condolence meeting organised by Ibn Sina Academy.

Jamuna Prasad Raahi, born in 1940 in Aligarh passed away on 04, June, 2017. He is survived by his wife, his five sons and three daughters. He has left behind a rich legacy of Urdu Poetry – Bansuri Ki Dhun (translated into English), Shabguzar, and Bazgashte Ghalib are few of his well-known works among many others. Jamuna Prasad Raahi won important awards like Sahitya Akademi award, Uttar Pradesh and Shikhar award. He is especially hailed in literary circles for his experiments in Urdu prosody and for his contribution to the genre of ghazal.

Participants including his close friend Engineer Khalid Faridi, commented on the use of motif, meter, understanding of intertextual space, and interconnection in the poetry of 'Raahi'. They further said, "we can pay more respect and homage to 'Raahi' by reading his contribution to verse and literature as 'Raahi' always said that this world is momentary and we all are mortals what all will remain is our contribution to the society and language".

'Raahi' was such a fine person who used help people in writing understanding Urdu poetry and always worked towards adding to the repository of Urdu language. He was determined and completely devoted towards his love for the Urdu language and poetry and never differentiated between religions. Participants further added, "the poetry of 'Raahi' was related to life, and we all are fortunate that 'Raahi' has sown the seeds of wisdom by his poetry and now it's our turn to harness the crop via reading and understanding his poetry. The loss and vacuum which has been created because of the demise of 'Raahi' will not be easy to fill. He will always be remembered for his contribution to the Urdu language and he will always live among us through his works".

Another participant, said that 'Raahi' was a lovable person. He was full of love and life and always loved life. They further said that time will do justice to the writings of 'Raahi' and if Urdu language lives for another 50 years than surely 'Raahi' will not only be remembered in Urdu literary circles but also in academia as well through scholarly research and seminars.

Jamuna Prasad 'Raahi' is also known and remembered among people as a lovable human being who loved young generation, always followed truth and never differentiated between his saying and doing.

Two Decades Association with Prof. B. N. Dhawan by S. Ziaur Rahman

On 16th June 2017 at around 3:10 pm, Dr. Alok Dhawan informed in a WhatsApp group, which I created for the upcoming Conference of Indian Society for Rational Pharmaco-therapeutics (ISRPT), that "his

father Prof. B. N. Dhawan has died today at 1:45 pm due to cardiac arrest and his last cremation will take place at the electric crematorium Baikhunt Dham, Lucknow at 5:30 pm". This was a shocking news to all the group members. Soon after, many condolences started flowing in the same WhatsApp group. Straightaway, I shared this news to my Facebook (FB) timeline, and again many of my FB friends including from non-Pharmacology discipline started sending their concern towards this departed soul.

Professor (Dr.) B. N. Dhawan had a special place in my heart. Although, I was very much junior in front of this great personality, vet I used to admire his in-depth knowledge and the way he addressed in any academic meetings. He was a regular participant of Indian Pharmacological Society (IPS) meetings. My first interaction with him was also during the Tridecennial (30th) Annual meeting of IPS in Jammu in 1997. Next year in 1998, Prof. K. C. Singhal, Head of our Department of Pharmacology, invited him as resource person for the International Workshop on ADR Monitoring at JNMC, AMU, Aligarh. Almost from that day, I started seeing him, whenever I got a chance.

On 2nd June 2007, he wrote to me an email with a message that he was assigned to write Biographies of Member Fellows of INSA including Prof. P. N. Saxena (1925-1999), a faculty member at our Department of Pharmacology. He also asked me to provide details of Prof. P. N. Saxena FNA, as he could not find much details elsewhere. I provided him all the information which he wanted including his past time hobbies and family history in addition to some original reprints of his publications. Prof. Dhawan had very kindly acknowledged me in the published biographies of FNA by Indian National Science Academy (INSA) in 2010. He recorded the acknowledgement as follows: "The author is grateful to Archives of the Academy and Dr. Sved Ziaur Rahman of Department of Pharmacology, JN Medical College (Aligarh) for providing many

biographical details. partial list of publications and photograph of Professor Saxena" [1]. Prof. Dhawan was so impressed and moved with that of my gesture in assisting in writing this biography, that on one day, he showed interest to visit my house to see our collection on medical heritage. On 25th August 2007, he along with Prof. P. K. Seth (Former Director, CSIR-ITRC) specially came to my place and appreciated our efforts in establishing the "Ibn Sina Academy of Medieval Medicine and Sciences" in Aligarh. In the visitors' book, he wrote, "It has been an exhilarating experience to see this unique and extensive collection of old manuscripts covering Unani Medicine, perhaps the best in the country. It must be preserved as a national heritage many manuscripts need urgent and digitization. We should be grateful for building this by their own efforts and they need all help and support in this unique institution. My grateful thanks for letting all through it and best wishes for proper utilization and conservation of this invaluable heritage".

As we all know, Prof. B. N. Dhawan retired from the services as Director, Central Drug Research Institute (CDRI), an autonomous institute of Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), Govt. of India. He joined the MBBS course in 1949 at KG Medical College, Lucknow, Pharmacology Demonstrator in on September 1954 after finishing MBBS course. Later he moved as Professor to organize the Department of Pharmacology at the newly started MLN Medical College, Allahabad in September 1963. He spent three months as Senior Commonwealth Medical Fellow at St Bartholomew's Medical College, London in the summer of 1971. He occupied several important positions in both government agencies and academic institutions. He illustrious research positions as Assistant Director, Deputy Director, Scientist in Director's Grade and Director at CDRI. Lucknow. He was heading ICMR Center for Advanced Studies on Traditional

Lucknow and visiting Remedies at professor at several foreign universities, consultant and or committee member of several prestigious international bodies such as IUPHAR, UNIDO, WHO and UNESCO. In government agencies, he was member and or chairman of many committees of ministries such as Ministry Earth Sciences, Ministry Environment, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Ministry of Petroleum and Chemical Industries besides Department and Technology of Science of Biotechnology Department (DBT), Department of Ocean Development (DOD). He was also associated in various capacity with Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) and Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR). He was appointed as honorary board of director, committee member of several public and private sector of pharmaceutical undertakings.

He played leading role in establishing Indian Pharmacological Society (IPS) in Patna in 1967 and was its Founder Fellow (FIPS). He remained President of IPS in 1981. He was conferred Fellowships by several other national and international organizations such as Indian Academy of (FIAN) and Neuroscience National Academy of Science India, Allahabad (NASI) and had chance to deliver several prestigious orations such as BK Anand Oration of National Academy of Medical Science. He was member of several academic bodies including British Society, Pharmacological Medicinal Chemistry Section of American Chemical Society and International Brain Research Organization.

He had published over 350 research papers, obtained 20 Foreign and 32 Indian Patents. He had written or edited 20 books. He received many prestigious awards namely Third World Academy of Sciences Award in Medical

Sciences, Hamdard Foundation Research Award, Vasvik Life Sciences Award, Ranbaxy Medical Sciences Award, OP Bhasin Medical and Health Sciences Award, DN Prasad Memorial Award of ICMR and Dhanwantari Prize of INSA.

Probably his last academic meeting was Golden Jubilee Inaugural Conference of IPS held at Patna in February 2017. Prof. K. C. Singhal from Aligarh attended this conference. He told me about the first meeting of IPS, which was also held 50 years back in Patna in 1967. Prof. Dhawan was as active as he was in 1967 in the same city. When Prof. Singhal was sharing with me all this 5 decades old association with him... and I was thinking that I too had now 2-decade good academic relationship with Prof. B. N. Dhawan.

I am sure many people will write more about him in the coming years. He will be badly missed by all of us. The Organizing Committee of ISRPTCON 2017 has decided to dedicate the conference, scheduled to be held in Aligarh from 19-21 November 2017, to the memory of late Prof. BN Dhawan.

Professor K. P. Gupta: An exemplary pharmacologist of India by S. Ziaur Rahman

Prof. K. P. Gupta died after prolong illness at the age of approximately 80 years on 13th April 2017 in the afternoon at his residence in New Delhi. He was born on December 1936 at Banda District of Uttar Pradesh and is survived by his wife, one son and two daughters. After basic education, he graduated in medicine

King George Medical from College, Lucknow (now KGMU). His topic of research at the post-graduation (MD) was "A neuropharmacological study of central cardiac control". After postgraduation, he immediately joined the created Department newly Pharmacology of Jawaharlal Nehru College, Medical Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh, as Lecturer in 1964. When he joined, his teacher and senior colleague of KGMU, Dr. P. N. Saxena and Dr. Om Chandra were already working as Professor and Reader in the Department. respectively. Prof. P. N. Saxena, Founding Head of the Department¹ specially encouraged him to make his career in experimental pharmacology.

Very soon, Dr. K. P. Gupta earned his place as a pivotal teacher and an exemplary researcher in the Department of Pharmacology. He was promoted to the post of 'Reader' and 'Professor' and led the Department as 'Head' during 8.8.1987-7.8.1990. During his career, he secured Trust 'Wellcome Scholarship' 'Common Wealth Fellowship' on different occasions to pursue further research work in England²⁻³. In England, he had a chance to work with a renowned pharmacologist of the world, Dr. Wilhelm Samuel Feldberg (1900-1993). Dr. Feldberg is famous for his work on snake venom and discovered liberation of histamine and endogenous mediators in it, which later on helped in the identification and partial isolation of Slow Reacting Substance of Anaphylaxis (SRS-A). He also assisted Dr. Henri Dale in his research work on neurotransmission. which chemical fetched him Nobel Prize in Medicine.

Dr. K. P. Gupta started working in the area of thermoregulation with Prof. Wilhelm S. Feldberg and Prof. P. N. Saxena and did some significant research work such as role of pyrogen and antipyretics on prostaglandin activity in CSF and morphine hyperglycaemia. Dr. A. S. Hilton in a chapter on the life and contribution of

Feldberg⁴, wrote, "Sabin Wendlandt and I were working in the Pharmacology Department of the School of Pharmacy of London University, only a few miles away from the National Institute of Medical Research at Mill Hill and Professor Feldberg kindly invited the two of us to spend one day a week in his laboratory, collaborating with him into the role of prostaglandin. In 1971 he and Saxena (PN Saxena) had recently confirmed our experiments on PGE1 and showed that an infusion of PGE1 into the ventricles could produce a sustained fever. They also were able to find a biologically active substance in cerebro-spinal fluid collected from the third cerebral ventricle. Saxena had returned to India by the time Sabine Wendlandt and I joined Professor Feldberg, however, we were joined by another scientist from India, K. P. Gupta. We developed a method for perfusing the cerebral ventricle system from the lateral ventricle to the cistern magna and collected the perfusate. We were able to show that no-control situation prostaglandins could be detected in the perfusing fluid whereas during fever the were elevated. When levels administered a variety of antipyretic agents, not only did the fever reduce, but also the levels of prostaglandins. Our initial results on the prostaglandins and their release during pyrogen fever were presented by Professor Feldberg himself at the first Thermoregulation Symposium held in San Francisco in 19725". Later experiments by Dey, Feldberg, Gupta, Milton, and Wendlandt in 1974 showed this sodium fever was completely unrelated to the bacterial pyrogen fever in that it was not abolished by antipyretic dugs, nor was there any evidence of the release of prostaglandins during the hypothermia".

Dr. K. P. Gupta published around 50 research papers in highly reputed journals like British Journal of Pharmacology, Journal of Physiology (London), Indian Journal of Pharmacology, Archives

Internationales De Pharmacodynamie et de Therapie, etc, with scientists like Dr. Wilhelm Feldberg, Dr. K. P. Bhargava, Dr. P. N. Saxena, Dr. A. S. Milton, Dr. Sabine Wendlandt, Dr. P. K. Dey, Dr. Om Chandra, Dr. K. C. Singhal. His citations could be found in the textbook of Goodman and Gilman (1975)⁶, periodicals like Nature (1972)⁷, Science Reporter (1974)⁸, Pharmacological Reviews (1972, 1975)⁹, Tropical Diseases Bulletin¹⁰, etc.

In the corporate life of the University, he played significant role in the establishment of Interdisciplinary Brain Research Centre (IBRC) at JNMC and Neuropharmacology lab at Department of Pharmacology. On 2nd of October 2012, he was invited to the JNMC as guest during the valedictory function of the college's golden jubilee celebrations.

The author of this obituary used to call him on and off after his retirement in 1996 and tried to invite him during the National Workshop on Alternatives to Animal Experimentation in 2014 and during the 14th Annual Conference of Society of Pharmacovigilance, India (SoPICON 2014), but due to his ailing health, he could not make out. However, he suggested to call his brother-in-law Dr. S. L. Gupta. Coordinator. Pharmacovigilance Program of Indian Medical Association, IMA Headquarters, New Delhi.

Let us pay our sincere condolence to his bereaved family and pray the Almighty God to lay his soul rest in peace (Amen).
