World Health Day Celebration 2022

World Health Day is a global health awareness day celebrated every year on 7th April, under the leadership of WHO, as well as other related organizations.

In 1948, the WHO held the First World Health Assembly. The Assembly decided to celebrate 7 April as the World Health Day (WHD) of each year with effect from 1950. The WHD is held to mark WHO's founding day and is seen as an opportunity by organizations to draw worldwide attention to a subject of major importance to global health each year. The WHO organizes local, regional international events on the Day related to a particular theme. WHD is acknowledged by various governments and non-governmental interests organizations with in public health issues, who also organize activities and highlight their support in media reports, such as our own Ibn Sina Academy.

To mark the WHD, Ibn Sina Academy on 7.4.2022 organised an exhibition of books and artefacts on the theme, "Our planet, our health". On the same occasion, Dr. Syed Ziaur Rahman, Professor at the Department of Pharmacology, Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, AMU, Aligarh delivered the 14th Prof. M. Nasim Ansari Oration. He spoke on issues of drugs polluting the environment. In addition, the Mayor of the city, Mohammad Furqan, in presence of Prof. Syed Zillur Rahman (President, Ibn Sina Academy) christened and laid the foundation stone of the 'Ibn Sina Street' in honour of Ibn Sina Academy, on behalf of the Municipal Corporation of Aligarh.

Mrs. Ahmadi Begum is survived by husband, three daughters Safia, Soofia and Asifa and one son Zia.

In memory of Prof. S. H. Hashmi

Prof. S. H. Hashmi, Founding Principal of Dr. Z. A. Dental College (ZADC), Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) passed away at a New Delhi hospital on June 1, 2022 after suffering from multiple organ failure. He retired from the university after serving as the ZADC Principal from 1996 to 2012.

"Prof Hashmi had a remarkable gift for friendship and built an extraordinarily wide acquaintance with colleagues and students who delighted in his company. He faced illness with remarkable courage", said Prof. Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman. He added: "Prof. Hashmi was a man of avocation. He loved

stamp collecting and played an active role in the Aligarh Philatelic Society. I share the sorrow of the deceased's bereaved family and I wish all of us to find comfort in his memories. He will be deeply missed by friends, colleagues and students". The deceased is survived by wife, daughter and son.

Jam-i-Jahan-Numa was the first Urdu language newspaper started in 1822 in Kolkatta by Harihar Dutta (Son of Tara Chand Dutta, eminent Bengali journalist). It was published under the editorship of Lala Sada Sukh Lal; a Punjabi. The printer was William Hopkins, a British national and an employee of the East India Company.

In Dehradun, Dr. Rahman visited many sight-seeing places including Robbers' Cave and met many scholars and public figures including Dr. Syed Farooq, Director, Himalaya Drug Company Pvt. Ltd, at Dehradun, with his friend Dr. Mirza Atif Beg (Head, Dept. Pharmacology, GRRIMS). Dr. Rahman had a detailed conversation with Dr. Farooq including his intetests in herbal medicine, hobbies in artefacts collection and maintenance of private museums. Dr. Faroog is an excellent man of avocations, a passionate lover of Urdu poetry, a successful industrialist, a keen social activist and a great socialite. He has a collection of more than a dozen old vintage cars and a beautiful collection of Our'anic manuscripts and calligraphic arts, which he showed personally to Dr. Rahman at his Himalaya Drug Factory as well as at his 'Tasmiya Academy', located at his residence.

Dr. Sumbul Rehman addressed the 4th International Health Services Congress' of the School of Persian Medicine, Tehran University of Medical Sciences

Dr. Sumbul Rehman from the Department of Ilmul Advia, Faculty of Unani Medicine, AMU, Aligarh, discussed structural features of medicinal plants and addressed challenges related to their cultivation and conservation in the '4th International Health Services Congress' of the School of Persian Medicine, Tehran University of Medical Sciences.

She shared these observations during an online talk on 'Issues and Challenges in Identification of Medicinal Plants'.

"Our surroundings are a rich storehouse of medicinal plants and everyone should know how to preserve them. Increasingly, medicinal species that reside in natural areas have received scientific attention, but we still know little about the treasure trove inhabiting our wild places", said Dr. Sumbul. She pointed out: "There is a pressure on the wild plant populations as overharvesting has placed many medicinal species at risk of extinction. Commercial exploitation is also leading to traditional medicines becoming unavailable".

"For all of these reasons, the study and conservation of medicinal plant species has become increasingly urgent. The accelerating loss of species and habitat worldwide adds to this urgency. Experts estimate that the Earth is losing at least one potential major drug every two years. It is high time for organizations and governments across the globe to rise up for meeting this challenge", stressed Dr. Sumbul.

Blood Donation Camp

IMA-MSN Aligarh wing in collaboration with Blood Bank of JNMC Hospital, AMU, Aligarh, organised a blood donation camp on 11th June 2022 in the college premises of JNMCH, AMU from 9am to 2pm. The camp was organised on the occasion of World Blood Donors' Day which falls on 14th June 2022. During this event, the beautiful IMA-MSN Annual Magazine 'Connectome Edition 2' was also launched.

Prof. Rakesh Bhargava, Dean Faculty of Medicine, as chief guest, said that "JNMC students have always been active in extending efforts for blood collection. 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PAST CONFERENCES/CMEs

Report of CMEs held at Faculty of Unani Medicine, AKTC, AMU, Aligarh

Department of Kulliyat

The Chief Guest of the valedictory session was Prof. Sartaj Tabbassum, Former Chairman Dept. of Chemistry, AMU, while the guests of honour were Dean Faculty of Unani Medicine Prof. F.S. Sherani, Principal Ajmal Khan Tibbiya College Prof. Shagufta Aleem and Former Chairman Dept. of Kulliyat, AMU Prof. Firasat Ali.

Teachers of Kulliyat from many Unani colleges across the country participated in the 6 days CME program, which started on 30th May 2022. During these 6 days, 12 resource persons were invited to take a theory and practical class. Besides core subjects of Unani Medicine, resource persons were from diverse backgrounds including Bio-Chemistry, Biotechnology, Physical Health Education and curriculum sciences.

The program also had two field visits, one to the manuscript section of the Maulana Azad library, AMU Aligarh and another to the Ibn Sina Academy of Medieval Medicine and Sciences on 3.6.2022. In addition to the resource persons who delivered scheduled lectures, an extensive lecture was also given by Padma Shri Prof. Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman. Beside this the CME included several practical demonstrations and hands-on activities.

During the CME, participants were exposed to eight valuable books and research material. These participants were from almost all parts of the country. The CME was organised by the

financial assistance of the Ministry of AYUSH, Govt. of India.

Department of Ilaj bit Tadbeer

The faculty members of the Department of Ilaj bit Tadbeer were provided with opportunities to update knowledge, skills and practices involved at different levels of regimental therapies and health care delivery systems in a Continuing Medical Education (CME) programme which concluded successfully.

Speaking on the relevance of regimental therapies in Ilaj bit Tadbeer, the Chief Guest of the inaugural function, Prof. Raisur Rahman (Former Advisor Unani, Ministry of AYUSH) remarked: "Regimental therapy was a popular treatment method by once ancient Unani scholars. However, in today's world when many medicines and treatment methods are coming with side effects, people are again looking for these applications of certain techniques and physical methods of treatment to improve the constitution of bodies".

In the valedictory function, the Chief Guest, Prof. S. M. Arif Zaidi (Dean, Faculty of Unani Medicine, Jamia Hamdard) stressed: "Like other methods of treatments, regimental therapy in Ilaj bit Tadbeer is an important mode in which the morbid matter present in the body is either dispersed, excreted or its unnecessary production is blocked or its flow is restricted and the diseases are cured by natural healing of body".

Prof. F. S. Sheerani (Dean, Faculty of Unani Medicine) and Prof. Shagufta (Principal, Aimal Khan Tibbiya College, AMU) welcomed the delegates and spoke about maintenance of general health and care through modulation or modification in Asbaab-e-Sitta Zarooriya (six essential factors for life). The Guest of Honour, Prof. Abdul Wadood (Director, National Institute of Unani Medicine) urged Unani scholars to produce more research and develop updated standard operating procedures for regimental therapies. Prof. M. M. H. Siddiqui talked about regimens mentioned in the classical Unani literature and new methods of regimental therapies. Dr. Faiza Abbasi (Director, UGC HRD Centre) called for adopting new techniques in teaching methodology. Dr. Nishat Quddus (Dept. of Physiotherapy, Hamdard University), Prof. Anisur Rahman (State Unani Medical College, Prayagraj) delineated special techniques and methods of regimental therapy to improve health as per the constitution of the body.

Prof. Mohd Anwar (Chairman and Organizing Secretary of the Programme) discussed how CMEs like these will go a long way in management of non-communicable diseases such as obesity, diabetes and hypertension among others. He also gave a summary report of the CME in the valedictory session.

Dr. Abdul Aziz Khan conducted the inaugural programme and Prof. Asia Sultana extended the vote of thanks in inaugural and valedictory sessions. Dr. M. Saad A. Khan (Convener) and Dr. M. Shoaib (Co-ordinator) carried out all the preliminary and follow-up tasks during the six-day CME.

CME For Unani Medical Officers

Unani medical officers updated their knowledge and skills in a six-day Continuing Medical Education (CME) programme of the Department of Ilaj Bit Tadbeer, Faculty of Unani Medicine, Aligarh Muslim University (AMU).

The CME was sponsored by the Ministry of AYUSH. Attending the inaugural function as the Chief Guest, Prof. Mohammed Haneef Beg (Former Pro-Vice-Chancellor, AMU and current Director, Academic program, F. H. Medical College and Hospital, Etemadpur, Agra) spoke on the importance of diet and lifestyle for prevention of heart diseases. He said: "A low-saturated fat, high-fibre, high plant food diet can substantially reduce the risk of heart and other diseases".

In the valedictory function, Prof. Shahid Ali Siddiqui (Principal, J N Medical College, AMU) pressed for adopting healthy behaviors in a daily life for preventing lifestyle diseases. Prof. F. S. Sheerani (Dean, Faculty of Unani Medicine) spoke about making healthy choices, getting enough sleep, regular health screening and regular physical activity. Prof. Shagufta Aleem (Principal, Ajmal Khan Tibbiya College (AKTC), AMU) shared tips on preventing chronic diseases and avoiding key risk behaviors.

The Guests of Honour, Prof. M. M. H. Siddiqui (Former Chairperson, Department of Ilaj Bit Tadbeer) and Prof. Misbahuddin Siddiqui (Former Chairperson, Department of Moalijat) discussed how regimental therapies can be used for lifestyle disease management.

Prof. Mohammad Aleemuddin Quamri, Prof. Abdul Haseeb Ansari (National Institute of Unani Medicine, Bangalore), Prof. Usha Singhal (Former Chairperson, Department of Physiology, J. N. Medical College), Dr. Sohrab Ahmad Khan (Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi) and Dr. Md. Tanwir Alam (Government Tibbi College, Patna) explained the prevention of chronic diseases through lifestyle choices such as quitting tobacco and alcohol and engaging in physical activity.

In the welcome address of the inaugural function, Prof. Asia Sultana (CME Joint Organising Secretary) stressed on the use of regimenal therapies. Prof. Asia and Dr Mohammad Saad A. Khan extended the vote of thanks in the inaugural and valedictory functions respectively. Prof Mohd Anwar gave a summary of the six-day programme. Dr M Shoaib coordinated the event. Around 30 medical officers from various states participated in the CME.

The delegates of the CMEs visited Ibn Sina Academy, where Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman gave an extensive talk on the importance of history of Unani medicine and preservation of medical heritage.

DOCUMENTATION

Reforming Medical Education in India – A Report

The Centre for Studies of Plural Societies (CSPS) organized an online 'Distinguished Lecture' on "Reforming Medical Education in India" on 16th April 2022 at 4.00 PM (IST). The lecture was delivered by Prof. Furqan Qamar and chaired by Prof. Syed Ziaur Rahman.

Prof. Furqan Qamar is a distinguished professor of management at the Centre for Management Studies, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi. Formerly, he served as the Secretary-General of the Association of Indian Universities. He also held the position of the vice-chancellor of the University of Rajasthan and the Central University of Himachal Pradesh. He served as the educational advisor in the Planning Commission of India. Moreover, he authored the book Financial Control in Indian Universities. He has also published several research articles and is a renowned columnist.

Prof. Furgan Qamar asserted that the interest in reforming medical education has grown since the war in Ukraine. He iterated that the capacity of the medical field is severely restrained in India. However, this does not mean that the number of medical colleges and their intake capacity has remained stagnant since independence. Data shows that almost 600 medical colleges and many zonal hospitals were converted to medical colleges. The central government has also set up the All India Institute of Medical Science (AIIMS, New Delhi) because that has been the nonpending demand. However, simultaneously as this expansion towards a better facility was taking place, he opined that this expansion was not enough and the facilities further needed expansion. However, while this expansion was taking place, there was another change. While in 1950-51, almost all medical colleges were under government domain with the idea of training people to serve the nation. During 1991-92 this started changing as high fee charges in medical education started making

entry into the system. In today's scenario of the above 600 colleges, almost half of them are private or in the private domain. The intake is deficient, with less than 100,000 students every year, half of which goes to the government and half to the private sector.

Prof. Qamar said that although there are limited seats, the demand for medical education is higher, with a large population wanting to pursue it. This demand has been proliferating with about 10-15% every year. Taking the example of 2021, Prof. Qamar points out that nearly 1.6 million students appeared in the undergraduate National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) examination, of which only 900,000 students qualified. The qualification requirements stated that if anyone scores above 50% marks or more, one has qualified and is eligible to pursue medical education. However, of these 900,000 students, only about 90,000 were admitted. Prof. Qamar explained how students go through various stages of the selection process. It is a tedious exercise through which few students remain dissatisfied and choose to re-attempt the examination failing which, some eventually select a different discipline, thereby giving up their dream of studying medical science.

Prof. Qamar stated that the government and the private fee difference is enormous. However, the government institutions have not received due support from the government, making work more difficult. He finally narrowed down that although almost 90,000 were selected, only 10,000 to 20,000 could pursue a degree abroad. Hence, in the case of Ukraine, we saw almost 20,000 coming homes. He claimed this to be a small number going abroad to study medical education rather than an "exodus." In the last report by the medical council, they identified 60 countries that are the significant destinations of medical education for Indian students. Earlier, when people were visiting the developed countries, these 60 countries were majorly the new generation destinations like China, where almost 8000 visits every year for medical education, followed by Russia taking about

3500 students and Ukraine taking almost 2500-2700 students. Central Asia emerged as one of the dominant locations for medical education. However, students pursuing a degree abroad and wanting to practice in India need to obtain a license by sitting for Foreign Medical Graduates Examination. Qualifying this examination is very low, ranging from 6-16% every year.

Speaking about the supply side, Prof. Qamar pointed out that the World Health Organisation (WHO) suggests that a country must have at least one doctor per 1000 people. India claims to have crossed this limit and has one doctor per 834 patients. However, when examined by some researchers, the supporting documents of India are claimed to be bloated, and they estimate that the actual number of people in that registry is close to half what the Medical Council of India (MCI) claims to be. Therefore, there is a need to double this number. There is a need to expand the medical colleges and their intake capacity, which is a tedious task. The tricky part is not the construction of the college but the faculty. According to Prof. Qamar, every country in the world suffers from a shortage of qualified, trained, and specialized doctors, which makes expansion further difficult.

Lastly, speaking on the issue of people travelling abroad and those who are unfortunately returning without completing the degree or after completing the education but cannot complete the Foreign Medical Graduate Examination (FMGE). He said this is a huge school, and there is no specific data on how many of them have a medical degree but have not qualified the FMGE. He predicted this number to be very high. However, there are a few reasons that support the inability of the students to qualify for FMGE. An objective view shows the difference in pedagogy and curricula as the key reasons for failure. The clinical practice experience, claimed Prof. Qamar, depends on the wide variety of patients these trainee doctors have access to. Doctors from India and Egypt are diseases due considered good because of their experience in treating and dealing with various to the large

population. Curing these patients makes the doctor more knowledgeable, which is difficult for a country with a lower population; another critical part is the importance of forensics as a part of the curricula. Students often take the help of coaching institutes to upgrade themselves to qualify for this examination. According to Prof. Qamar, if these aspirants are identified, along with the number of students who could not qualify the FMGE, the existing medical colleges could start crash courses, enabling them to qualify FMGE. If followed through, they can be added to the existing pool of doctors. Medical education has been outstanding in one aspect; there has been continuous professional development across all branches of knowledge, unlike many other disciplines. Hence, bringing the above solution into practice would go a long way.

The lecture was followed by the question and answer session and the final remarks by the chair, Prof. Syed Ziaur Rahman. He emphasized that the government of India is trying its best to harmonize and standardize medical education with the standard of the foreign countries, for example, competency-based medical education system, which will provide India with lifelong learners and leadership qualities and communicators. It was only a pedagogical system and a knowledge-based examination, and no skillbased examination. India is trying to follow the medical education system in the West. He further emphasized the need to reduce the cost of medical education. Prof. Rahman concluded that there needs to be openness, transparency, and efficiency in the medical field, and there must also be a check on the malpractices.

National Conference on Current Situation of Country and Our Response

The two-day National Conference on "Current Situation of Country and Our Response", by All India Muslim Majlis Mashawarat (AIMMM) was held at India Islamic Culture Centre, New Delhi during 20 to 21 May 2022.

Several steps were proposed by a couple of delegates during the first day of the event. Notably, Jamaat-e-Islami Hind (JIH) chief Saadatullah Hussaini and Ittehad-e-Millat Council Party chief Maulana Tauqeer Raza on the first day had proposed some concrete measures to tackle the increasing communal situation. Precisely, Raza had underlined the need to hold demonstrations across the country and fill jail (*jail bharo*) on one day. On the other hand, Hussaini had proposed confidence-building measures and winning the hearts and minds of the majority.

"What's the use of the declaration which has no suggestions or action plan to tackle the problems being faced by the Muslim community?," asked a delegate who was also one of the speakers in the event, adding that there should be some concrete measures to protect mosques, protect lives of the Muslims, protect lynching etc. Issuing a declaration without a roadmap to implement it makes no sense, said many other participants and even questioned the relevance of the 10-point plans.

As many as 150 delegates from 18 states came to Delhi to attend this conference. During the meeting, the issue of giving a miss to the Popular Front of India (PFI) and Social Democratic Party of India (SDPI) was also raised, but Hamid stated that the AIMMM didn't give membership to any organisations which had non-Muslims in the leadership role. He was reminded that the Muslim League has many non-Muslim leaders and above all PFI has no non-Muslim in its rank and file.

AIMMS is a platform which was formed to unite Muslims, among the community organisations at a time when it is supposed to bring all concerned Muslim bodies and individual on board.

The conference was attended by many scholars and community leaders including Maulana Asghar Ali Imam Mehdi Salafi (Ameer Jameaat Ahle Hadees Hind), Advocate Feroz Ahmad Ansari (President, All India Momin Conference), Mohd Ziauddin Nayyar (President, Tameer-e Millat, Hyderabad), ET Mohd Basheer (MP, Muslim League, Kerala), Shabber Ahmad Ansari (President, All India Muslim OBC Organisation), Jawaharullah (MLA, Chennai), Hafiz Syed Athar Ali (President, Ulema Board, Mumbai) and Prof. Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman (President, Ibn Sina Academy, Aligarh).

Below here is the declaration issued on the conclusion of the two-day event on 20 May:

- 1. We will follow Islam and stick to our cultural identity strictly
- 2. We will oppose any attempt to make the Constitution defunct or change it.
- 3. We will start dialogue with all sections of the society
- 4. We will leave no stone unturned to protect the constitutional rights to all citizens including Muslims and marginalized groups
- 5. We will pressurize government to protect mosques and help the victims of bulldozers politics and communal riots
- 6. We will boycott those media which are involved in hate campaign against Muslims
- 7. We encourage the efforts of young Muslim men and women who for their courageous role in ensuring peace and justice
- 8. We will continue our efforts for educational, financial and social development.
- 9. We declare that we will work on common problems of the community and the country unitedly.
- 10.AIMMM will try to implement the above declaration at center, state and local level.

The Central Council for Research in Unani Medicine (CCRUM) is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. It was established on 30 March 1978; however, it started functioning in January 1979. Since inception, the Council has been busy in researching various fundamental and applied aspects of Unani Medicine. Over the years, the CCRUM has emerged as the world-leader in the field of research in Unani Medicine.

THE NETWORK

The CCRUM has 23 research centers functioning in different parts of the country, besides its headquarters in New Delhi.

AREAS OF ACTIVITY

The Research Programme of the Council has four major components:

- Clinical Research
- Drug Standardization
- Literary Research
- Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Some of the significant achievements of the Council are as follows:

Clinical Research

- Developed 27 Unani drugs, which are purely natural, standardized and without any side-effects, for successful treatment of vitiligo, sinusitis, infective hepatitis, eczema, filariasis, malaria, rheumatoid arthritis, bronchial asthma and some other common ailments.
- Obtained 15 patents on for developing certain novel therapeutic compositions and SCAR primers.



Drug Standardization

- Developed pharmacopoeial standards for 298 single and 150 compound drugs. Besides, Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for manufacture of 50 compound drugs have also been finalized.
- Published six volumes of National Formulary of Unani Medicine, six volumes of Unani Pharmacopoeia of India (UPI), Part 1 (on single drugs), and three volumes of the UPI, Part 2 (on compound drugs).

Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants

- Collected over 104,568 specimens of medicinal plants belonging to 1,800 species from the wild.
- Undertaken successful cultivation of 33 important medicinal species.
- Gathered and documented over 16,261 folk medicinal claims.

Literary Research

- Translated 56 volumes of 21 classical books/manuscripts from Arabic/Persian into Urdu and other languages.
- Prepared a database of 2,400 manuscripts of Unani Medicine.
- Reprinted over 70 rare classical books.
- Compiled Standard Unani Medical Terminology for 4,028 terms of Unani Medicine.
- Developed 'Standard Unani Treatment Guidelines for Common Diseases'.

Publications

• Produced over 2,000 research papers and brought out about 400 publications, besides regular publication of a quarterly bulletin *CCRUM Newsletter*, quarterly Urdu Journal *Jahan-e-Tib* and quarterly English Journal *Hippocratic Journal of Unani Medicine*.
