

'World Mental Health Day 2022' Observed

World Health Organisation (WHO) recognises World Mental Health Day on the 10th of October every year. This year, the theme was "Making Mental Health a Global Priority." During this event, a program was organised at Ibn Sina Academy where a script on the topic was presented by Ms. Sheeza Shoeb, grand-daughter of Prof. Syed Zillur Rahman and undergraduate student of Psychology from the Aligarh Muslim University, entitled 'Prioritising Mental Health Globally'.

Mental health affects an individual's thoughts, behaviours, and feelings, and these problems exist in our lives, families, workplaces, and communities, impacting everyone. Worldwide, at least one in eight of us is affected by mental health issues. Despite this, the services, skills, and funding available for mental health remain short in supply and fall far below their requirements, especially in low- and middle-income countries.

Although the focus on mental health has risen recently, it is still one of the most neglected sectors of public health. Every year, we realise that more awareness should be raised about mental welfare to support those with such difficulties. There must also be an increase in accessibility to these services that cater to all sections of society, not just the privileged. If mental health is a problem for everyone in society, then access to support should also be available for everyone. However, we observe that this is not the case. In fact, mental health is a crisis globally.

Despite efforts to provide care, this minimal progress is usually made only by the wealthy and for adults. Children as well as the impoverished are frequently left out of this conversation. The youth suffer as they naturally have trouble expressing their concerns to their peers out of shame and embarrassment, financial dependency, and reduced access to any support system. Only

when these significant barriers are eliminated can we expect any change. In India alone, children with mental health disorders are mostly undiagnosed and unable to seek any form of help. According to the "Indian Journal of Psychiatry," in 2019, at least 50 million children in India were affected by mental health issues, and 80 to 90 percent had not sought support.

Therefore, the WHO and the World Bank have proposed several plans of action for combating mental health stigma around the world. The first idea is for a new mental healthcare system. Through public awareness and community engagement, authorities need to develop a system that tunes to the needs of society. For instance, establishing independent monitoring body with transparent and inclusive staff. Apart from that, services outside of the health sector are also vital. These include parenting programmes, anti-stigma campaigns, schoolbased and workplace interventions, online education programs, and digital tools to provide healthcare according to the convenience of a patient.

Another major issue is substance abuse among children. This is more common than one might think. The younger a child initiates alcohol and other drug use, the higher the risk for serious health consequences. One of the main reasons children consume such substances is due to poor mental health. Harolyn M. E. Belcher and Harold E. Shinitzky say that poor self-image, low religiosity, poor school performance, parental rejection, family dysfunction, abuse, too much or too little control by parents, and divorce are all linked to drug use during adolescence.

Thus, we are glad to have possibly been able to make a change through this event. It is apparent that mental health is not prioritised the way it should be. Children are a largely ignored section of society when it comes to

mental welfare. Mental health should no longer be regarded as something obscure. Even though it is not a simple task, it is not impossible to ask for. Countries around the globe need to step up their game to prioritise mental health.

Condolence Meeting to remember Poet Ahmad Ali Barqi Azmi

A much-loved person by all, whom we lost on 5.12.2022, narrated many poems on many occasions, also wrote few poems in honour of both Ibn Sina Academy and persons associated with my family members, said Hakim Syed Zillur Rahman, in a condolence meeting.

Ahmad Ali Barqi Azmi was born on 25 December 1954 and died in Jaunpur at the age of 67 (buried in Kot, Azamgarh). He was a poet par excellence in the Urdu language. His poetic collections included *Rooh-e-Sukhan* (2013) and *Mahshare Khayal* (2020). In this massive work, he treats traditional subject matter, such as romantic love and spiritual devotion, but also non-traditional topics such as the Internet and global health crises. He includes tributes to Urdu literary giants,

including Mir Taqi Mir, Ghalib, Iqbal, Sir Syed and Faiz Ahmad Faiz. He continued to publish new poems online in numerous international Urdu poetry forums. Barqi's father, Rahmat Elahi Barqi, was also a renowned poet in Urdu, well known for his collection *Tanweer-e-Sukhan*, or "The Light of Language."

Professionally, he served in the Persian service of All India Radio, New Delhi. He devoted his life to furtherance of the Urdu language and its literary culture. Barqi served as Translatorcum-Announcer (T/A In-charge) in the Persian Service of the External Services Division of All India Radio, New Delhi. He has traveled extensively, including to Iran and Afghanistan, on study tours. In addition to his own writing, he devoted his time and efforts to the furtherance of Urdu literary culture, promoting the works of Urdu poets of the past and present. In live forums and recitations, on television, radio, and social media, Dr. Barqi continued to spread international interest in the unique literary and cultural traditions of Urdu.

Ahmad Ali Barqi was educated at Shibli National College in Azamgarh and at Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. He held a degree in Education, a master's degree in Urdu and Persian, and received a doctorate in Modern and Classical Persian from the Centre of African & Asian Languages of Jawaharlal Nehru University in 1996. He was recipient of Academy Award, conferred by Urdu Academy, New Delhi.

Just 15-16 days back before his death, he provided the telephone number of Dr. Khawar Hashmi as his number was misplaced.

"Prof. Asif always made the classroom brighter with his knowledge and wisdom. That will definitely be gravely missed", said, Prof. Syed Ziaur Rahman of the Department of Pharmacology, JNMC, AMU, Aligarh. He recalled: "Prof. Asif was an inspiration to his colleagues for his focus, discipline and dedication. He was an exemplary human being who was always easily accessible to everyone".

Prof. Asif was 64 years old and had one more year to retire from the services. In his 40 years of research and 32 years of teaching experience; Prof. Asif taught the MBBS, BDS, Medical Lab Technology, Pharmacy, MD, M. Phil and PhD students and served as the Chairman, Department of Biochemistry for two terms. He published numerous papers in peer-reviewed journals and the 'Role of modified proteins and nucleic acids in various diseases' was his thrust area.

International Seminar on Syed-ul-Ulama Allama Ali Naqi Naqvi

The life and awe-inspiring academic achievements of eminent religious scholar and former AMU faculty member Syedul-Ulama Allama Ali Naqi Naqvi were discussed in a two-day international seminar held under the aegis of the Department of Shia Theology, Aligarh Muslim University (AMU).

Addressing the inaugural session at the JNMC Auditorium, the Chief Guest Prof. Ainul Hasan (Vice-Chancellor, Maulana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad) said, "Syedul Ulama was born in the era of sociopolitical decline of Muslims. The Muslim world, including Turkey, Iran, Afghanistan, and India was facing the onslaught of Western imperialism. At that time, Allama Ali Nagi Nagvi with his intellectual acuity and rational ability interpreted theological issues enabling Islamic teachings to live up the challenges thrown open by the modern world. Throwing light on the political and intellectual scenario of the late nineteenth century and the first half of the twentieth century Professor Syed Ainul Hasan said that Allama Nagvi pitched for unity and brotherhood. His three hundred books and more than one thousand articles bear testimony to his academic calibre and *Ijtehad*.

In his presidential remarks, AMU Vice-Chancellor Prof. Tariq Mansoor said, "Allama Ali Naqi Naqvi was a great intellectual whom we became familiar with during our student days at AMU. "He had no formal university education yet his knowledge stemming from academic rigour made him a profound scholar who was recognized globally. His example tells us that having a high academic degree is not enough for a person to be called as educated and good behaviour and conduct with intellectual bearings is necessary", Prof Mansoor emphasized.

The Vice-Chancellor said that great scholars like him have served in the Faculty of Theology of AMU. "It is the responsibility of

today's faculty members and students to carry forward his legacy and encourage high academic standards and environment in the Department. The university administration is always ready to provide all kinds of support in this regard", he said.

Prof. Mansoor further said, "AMU is a unique institution in the sense that modern sciences are taught here along with oriental subjects. This uniqueness can strengthen our reputation and identity with quality teaching and research. There is a need for teachers to take this fact into consideration, neglect trivial matters and spend their energy on greater issues". Talking about the inter-faith dialogue. the Vice-Chancellor said there should be peace and tolerance among the followers of different religions. "Commonalities should highlighted while paying attention to bridging the gulf by putting aside the differences", he stressed. Professor Mansoor further stressed upon the Shia-Sunni unity and strengthening bonds between communities. The Vice-Chancellor hoped that people would emulate Ali Nagi Nagvi.

Earlier, in the opening remarks, Iran's renowned scholar Ayatullah Mahdavipoor said that Syedul Ulama Allama Ali Naqi Naqvi was a visionary *mujtahid* who was not only knowledgeable in tafsir and hadith but also had command of jurisprudence, theology, philosophy and sociology. He was a distinguished scholar of his times and various scholars from Najaf recognized his contributions.

The guest of honour Dr. Mohd. Ali Rabbani (Cultural Counsellor, Embassy of Iran, New Delhi) said that Syedul Ulama was a great intellectual who resisted the invasion of modernity, imperialism and western civilization and strongly defended Islamic teachings. "Allama Naqi Naqvi was an expert in various streams of knowledge and he interpreted Islamic teachings with intellectual rationality. He used to emphasize on dialogue and outreach, owing to which he became popular in every circle" Dr. Rabbani said.

Speaking on interfaith relations Dr. Zafar Mahmood (Zakat Foundation of India) said "in the Holy Qur'an, the phrases "Lord of mankind" and "Lord of the worlds" have appeared repeatedly, which tells that mankind is one big family and race, colour, sex and tribe are for identification purposes only". He further said, the importance of dialogue and communication has been highlighted in all religions, and the Constitution of India, the United Nations Charter and other international documents have equally given priority to interfaith dialogue and interaction, as the most beautiful plant in the world is love which grows in hearts.

Prof. Syed Tayyab Raza Naqvi (Chairman, Department of Shia Theology and Director of the Seminar) delivered the welcome address and delineated the topic of the seminar. On this occasion, the translation of Tafsir Majma Al-Bayan, and a book on Syedul Ulama by Dr. Asghar Ajaz were also released. In the opening session, Dr. Asghar Ajaz proposed the vote of thanks, and Dr. Shariq Aqeel conducted the proceedings.

In the later session, Maulana Safi Haider (Secretary, Tanzeemul Makatib, Lucknow), Maulana Kalbe Jawad Naqvi, Prof. Hakeem Syed Zillur Rahman, Shahid Mehdi (Former Vice Chancellor, Jamia Millia Islamia), Mr. Ali Zaidi (Chairman, Shia Central Waqf Board, Lucknow) and other dignitaries expressed their views.

The Central Council for Research in Unani Medicine (CCRUM) is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India. It was established on 30 March 1978; however, it started functioning in January 1979. Since inception, the Council has been busy in researching various fundamental and applied aspects of Unani Medicine. Over the years, the CCRUM has emerged as the world-leader in the field of research in Unani Medicine.

THE NETWORK

The CCRUM has 23 research centers functioning in different parts of the country, besides its headquarters in New Delhi.

AREAS OF ACTIVITY

The Research Programme of the Council has four major components:

- Clinical Research
- Drug Standardization
- Literary Research
- Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

Some of the significant achievements of the Council are as follows:

Clinical Research

- Developed 27 Unani drugs, which are purely natural, standardized and without any side-effects, for successful treatment of vitiligo, sinusitis, infective hepatitis, eczema, filariasis, malaria, rheumatoid arthritis, bronchial asthma and some other common ailments.
- Obtained 15 patents on for developing certain novel therapeutic compositions and SCAR primers.

Survey and Cultivation of Medicinal Plants

- Collected over 104,568 specimens of medicinal plants belonging to 1,800 species from the wild.
- Undertaken successful cultivation of 33 important medicinal species.
- Gathered and documented over 16,261 folk medicinal claims.

Literary Research

- Translated 56 volumes of 21 classical books/manuscripts from Arabic/Persian into Urdu and other languages.
- Prepared a database of 2,400 manuscripts of Unani Medicine.
- Reprinted over 70 rare classical books.
- Compiled Standard Unani Medical Terminology for 4,028 terms of Unani Medicine.
- Developed 'Standard Unani Treatment Guidelines for Common Diseases'.

Publications

• Produced over 2,000 research papers and brought out about 400 publications, besides regular publication of a quarterly bulletin *CCRUM Newsletter*, quarterly Urdu Journal *Jahan-e-Tib* and quarterly English Journal *Hippocratic Journal of Unani Medicine*.
